THE BRAD ARMS SCHOLARSHIP FUND was established by Bob and Betty Arms in memory of their son, Corporal Bradley Thomas Arms. Brad, a Covenant School graduate, was killed in Iraq on November 19, 2004 while serving his country.

Brad embraced the mission of The Covenant School in achieving academic excellence as an honor student, serving others through many community service projects, and participating as an exceptional athlete on the soccer, tennis, and lacrosse teams. Most importantly, Brad's faith and love of Jesus Christ was an integral part of his education at The Covenant School.

He graduated from Covenant in 2002, attended the University of Georgia, and joined the Sigma Phi Epsilon fraternity. After his sophomore year, Brad was called to active duty as a member of the Marine Reserves. Brad's outstanding leadership abilities quickly promoted him to the rank of Corporal. Brad prayed with others and encouraged them throughout his time in the service. The morning he died he told a friend, "No matter what happens on this mission, always remember Romans 8:28: *And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love Him, who have been called according to His purpose.*". He was killed by small arms fire at the age of 20 while trying to save a fellow Marine.
